Thank you for making the Lifewise Big Sleepout 2016 a record-breaking achievement!

On Thursday 7 July, the 7th annual Lifewise Big Sleepout saw 135 of Auckland's most influential movers and shakers brave one cold, wet wintry night to sleep rough.

There was thunder and lightning as the weather put on a display that only highlighted how vulnerable the city's homeless are to the elements and how difficult it can be to remain warm and dry without a home.

Thanks to your generous support, you not only raised awareness about homelessness but also helped these "rough sleepers" raise over \$333K to kickstart the Housing First Project. We are expecting to commence the first pilot of this programme in October this year, to pave the way for implementation in 2017.



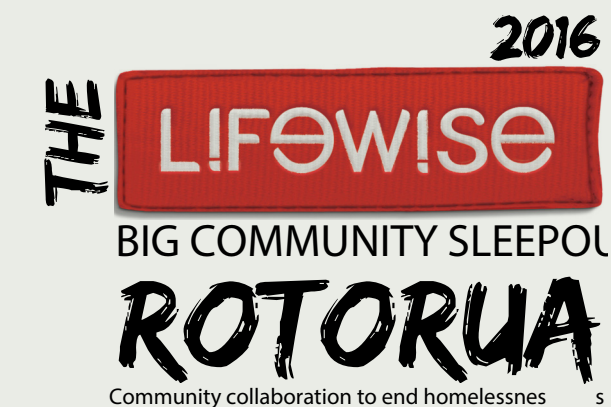
Come To The Big Sleepout Rotorua

This year, the Big Sleepout in Rotorua has a new name, new location, a new date, plus, everyone's invited!



In July 2015, 38 community, iwi Representatives and political leaders slept rough in Pukuatua Street car park to fundraise to end homelessness in Rotorua. The \$35K raised has been used to give back to the community via grants to Rotorua agencies Shake Up, Love Soup Rotorua, Salvation Army, Waiariki Women's Welfare League, and CFM Ministries.

This year, the event has been given a new name that better represents Rotorua's community based spirit. It will be held on **20 October**, coinciding with events around homelessness and mental health awareness in Rotorua. This year's **Lifewise Big Community Sleepout Rotorua** aims to increase



awareness of the Rotorua Homeless Action Plan. It's about collaboration, working with iwi and other agencies to end homelessness in Rotorua. All money raised during the Lifewise Big Community Sleepout Rotorua goes directly towards supporting non-funded projects from voluntary groups working with Homeless and or Rough Sleepers in Rotorua.

New Funding For Housing First

Hon. Minister Paula Bennett announced new funding for the Housing First project over the next two years. Lifewise will bid for funding from this pool.

You believed in Housing First. And now the government believes in it, too! Thank you so much for your support.

"This is a major step forward," says Moira Lawler, Lifewise Chief Executive. There has been little government funding dedicated towards a sustainable approach to ending homelessness. But now Lifewise along with Auckland's most hardworking social and government agencies, can put in place the Housing First model.

Housing First follows a simple guiding principle. A person who is experiencing homelessness needs a home first. After that, wrap-around services can address other needs. For example, mental health counselling, finding a job, or coping with addiction. While the funding is definitely a shot in the arm, it is not enough to solve a problem as complex as homelessness. This funding cannot cover the costs of housing every homeless person. We will need to continue looking for ongoing resources and we will continue to need your support.

World Homeless Day is on 10 October. Preparations are underway to mark World Homeless Day in Auckland city centre's Aotea Square. There are over 200 people in Auckland's city centre who are homeless.
